**110 YEARS DE YOUNG**

More than a century after it first opened to the public, and five years after it was closed for refurbishment following earthquake damage, San Francisco's de Young museum reopens its doors. It's worth checking out for the stunning copper-covered building alone, designed by world-renowned architects Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron to complement its Golden Gate Park surroundings. Four inaugural exhibitions present an eclectic array of delights, from ancient Egyptian relics to Jasper Johns prints.
